800,000 Fords Recalled

Since our story in the last issue about reports of F-150's, Explorers, and Lincoln Navigators burning up, Ford has issued a recall of 800,000 of the vehicles from the 2000 model year. Reason? They have a nasty habit of bursting into flames, even while parked and unattended.

Some Ford owners are pushing for a recall in other years as well.

A couple of TV stations - WESH in Orlando, Florida, and KHOU in Houston, Texas - have tracked down hundreds of cases of trucks that have caught on fire. In nearly all cases, station reporters say the problem has been traced to faulty switches located under the hood. Consultants hired by the station feel the recall should be widened to include vehicles from 1997 to 2002. The problem is so serious, owners are being told not to park the trucks in garages or near any other structures until the recall work is done. (Excerpted from www.poynter.org)

Outlawing Potluck Dinners

It is now illegal for churches in some parts of North America to hold potluck dinners. Several states have passed regulations outlawing them, turning church ladies into a new class of criminal.

However, the backlash from hungry church-goers might help turn back the tide of ridiculous regulations. Citizens in Washington state raised such a stink after such community meals were banned, that a new law exempting potlucks from state food safety laws was passed. Potlucks will be legal again this May.

Minnesota also had to pass a law recently to exempt churches and schools from anti-potluck laws.

In Canada, church fundraising potlucks and bake sales are being cancelled across the country, according to recent magazine reports. The issue came to a head last year at the Rosy Rhubarb Festival in Shedden, Ontario, when a person selling pies was told to stop because the kitchen where the pies had been baked had not been inspected by the health authorities. Witnesses reported that the ensuing discussion turned ugly, with pies being hurled at the inspector.

World's First Underwater "Bridge"

A friend of mine recently sent me the above photo of a first-of-its-kind bridge that runs between Sweden and Denmark. You drive out over the water on a conventional causeway and then, about halfway across, the road heads down underwater through a tunnel that runs deep enough so ships can still pass overhead. Before reaching the other side, the road comes back up to the surface. Builders say the underwater "bridge" was cheaper than trying to go up and over.

Things Grow Better With Coke

Farmers in India have discovered that Coca-Cola sprayed on cotton and chili crops destroys pest insects. "I observed that the pests began to die after the soft drink was sprayed on my cotton," Gotu Laxmaiah, a farmer from Ramakrishnapuram, in Andra Pradesh told The Guardian newspaper.

Laxmaiah says cola sprays are safe, don't need to be diluted and are cheap.

One litre of highly concentrated Avant, Tracer and Nuvocon, three popular Indian pesticides, costs around 10,000 rupees (\$200), but 1.5 litres of locally made Coca Cola is 30 rupees (50 cents). To spray an acre would be a mere 270 rupees (\$6).
