Pump Water With Your Lawn Mower

Now you can pump water out of low spots, flooded basements or buildings by equipping your lawnmower with "Mow Pump", manufactured by Stuart Machine Works, Indiantown, Fla. The pump replaces the mower blade and can pump up to 100 gal. a minute, using only the lawnmower engine for power.

The self-priming pump can be left running even when water is not being pumped through. Cliff Stuart, the designer, notes that you can also pump sand and mud through the pump without damaging it. An added use, he notes is for pumping liquid fertilizer. The fertilizer corrodes conventional pump gaskets and seals, but not so with the Mow Pump. It has no seals, gaskets, check valve or suction hose.

To attach the Mower Pump to your rotary mower, you remove the blade and slide the pump over the shaft.

You'll need to drill two holes in the mower housing to bolt on the pump support bar. The pump fits on 20 to 24 in. mowers with 3½ hp. or larger engines. It's 5 in. in dia. and weighs 15 lbs. Stuart notes that the initial installation takes about one hour.

The pump sits within the mower housing so you can wheel the mower around normally. Stuart adds that with some modifications, the pump could be attached to riding mowers.

The company also sells a self-contained Mow Pump that has its own frame and engine.

The Mow Pump for lawnmowers sells for \$125, and the self-contained unit, equipped with a 3½ hp engine, sells for \$287.50.

New Easy-To-Read "Remote" Rain Gauge


"I had the idea 29 years ago," says Adam Hauch, Westlock, Alberta, about his inexpensive new rain gauge that's easy to read from as far as 25 ft. away.

Hauch's new gauge is bigger than almost any other rain gauge at 16½ in. tall. It's designed with an upper funnel-shaped mouth that's 4 times the size of the gauge tube itself so that every inch of rain that falls registers as 4 in. inside the gauge. A strip of orange backing tape on the back of the gauge is magnified as rain fills the tube so that the back of the tube looks solid orange up to the top of the water level, making it easy to read from inside the house or any other remote location.

The gauge mounts quickly on any white background with two mounting brackets. It'll measure up to 3 in. of rainfall.

The gauge sells for \$14.99, including postage.

Electronic Rain Gauge Never Needs Emptying

You don't even have to get out of bed to see how much rain fell overnight with a new electronic rain gauge that empties itself and has a remote indicator that installs anywhere.

The RainWise gauge measures rain by weight with a plastic collector pan that dumps itself as it "counts" the rain.

The gauge consists of the collector pan, sealed electronic base unit, up to 100 ft. of wire that's thin enough to allow a window to close over it, and the remote indicator made of black matte plastic. The collector counts rain by tenths of an inch and empties itself as each tenth accumulates, sending a signal to the indicator inside which registers the count. The indicator counts up to 999.9 in. of rain but can be reset at any time to zero by pushing a reset button. The

only regular maintenance required by the unit is to keep the collector free of leaves and other debris.

The unit is powered by a 9-volt battery which lasts about a year. It installs on a fencepost, roof, deck or wherever you wish with just two screws.

The gauge comes with 30 ft. of wire and sells for \$49.95, plus \$3.00 for shipping. A more advanced unit that measures rain to 1/100th of an inch sells for \$69.95. The company also makes remote electronic temperature monitors that register highs and lows over a 24 hr. period.
