As this issue of FARM SHOW went to press, contributing editor Lorn Manthey returned home from the Farm Progress Show in Decatur, Ill. He reports that the show is "still the place to go to see how the big boys farm". Here are a few new products that caught his eye:

Manure "Boat" Agitates Big Lagoons

You've never seen anything like this giant amphibious pump that drives into big lagoons on 4 tractor wheels and then floats like a boat. Big agitators mix up even the toughest crusts Once the lagoon is



empty, the unit drives itself out. Controlled by a hand-held remote. Nuhn Industries had tremendous interest at the show. Units sell for \$135,000. (ph 877 837-7323; www.nuhn.ca)

World's Biggest Cornhead



Cornhead genius Marion Calmer showed off his big-gest header yet - a 30-row, 12-in. behemoth mounted on a Deere combine. Calmer says it will harvest nearly 1,000 bu. in 6 min., which should win it a spot in the Guiness Book of World Records. Harry Stine of Stine Seeds plans to plant

at 50,000 seeds per acre, with equidistant 12-in. spacing (using a custom-built planter), shooting for a 300 bu. per acre yield. Header has ultra narrow poly dividers and two Calmer chopping rolls per row - but only a single gathering chain. (ph 309 629-9000; www.calmercornheads.com)

World's Biggest Spray Boom

At 150 ft., this is the biggest commercial spray boom ever built. The Boyd Ag re-tractable boom is made from the same aircraft aluminum used to

Plastic-Wrapped Straw Bales

"I've never seen anything like it," says frequent FARM SHOW contributor Andrew Sewell in England talking about the sight of a harvested wheat field full of several hundred plastic-wrapped straw bales. North Yorkshire farmer Malcolm Metcalfe tried the experiment this summer to see if he could keep straw in better condition. The value of straw has gone up considerably in the area, both for bedding and winter feed. Last year 5-ft. round bales sold for \$15 to \$19 a bale, in part because of the long wet winter.

Metcalfe, who doesn't have enough inside storage for all his straw, decided to try wrapping the bales. He wanted to wrap each bale with just two layers of plastic but his bale wrapper would only let him do a minimum of four layers (he wraps silage bales 8 times). Bales are stabbed in the ends with a bale spear to allow them to breathe.

A Great Use Of The Internet

If you get tired of eating in restaurants when traveling for fun or work-related reasons, check out this new website that helps you find a home-cooked meal wherever you are.

EatWith.com matches travelers with local residents. Cofounder Guy Michlin got the idea during a trip to Crete, where a friend arranged for his group to have dinner with a local family. "It was an amazing experience for us, not just the food but also connecting with people who lived in the area we were visiting," says Michlin. When he got home, he and a business partner started working on the new business.

Host families on EatWith have to go through a vetting process as far as their food offerings, interpersonal skills, and the cleanliness of their homes. On the website (www. eatwith.com) hosts are rated by visitors. In the future, visitors may also be rated.

There are other person-to-person websites cropping up that connect travelers with locals: www.vayable.com matches tourists with local residents who act as tour guides. Another site, www.airbnb.com, is a network of people who rent out rooms in their homes to travelers, everything from a night on a couch in the living room (very cheap) to a week-long takeover of a regular family's house.

Europe Passes Tractor Vibration Rules

The European Union recently enacted "whole body vibration" rules designed to protect workers from health risks due to vibration on tractors and other farm equipment. Critics of the new rules passed by the EU say they could limit the time farmers spend in their tractors to less than 1 hr. a day.

A spokesman for the EU says, "Whole-body vibration can have debilitating and often life-changing health implications, particularly through back pain." However, George Lyon, a Scottish member of the European Parliament said, "If these rules are implemented and enforced without flexibility, we could end up with a situation where some people will not be able to plow their fields. This would be an utterly ludicrous state of affairs." A regulator responded, "It's mostly equipment built before 2007 that will not meet vibration guidelines. By rotating jobs and buying new equipment, farmers will be able to meet the whole-body guidelines.'
