## Automatic Feeder For Remote Areas

Remote areas on your farm or ranch may become more accessible with the automatic Lehman feeder, designed to feed wild game but often used for livestock.

"Sheep and goat users especially like them to keep range animals near areas where they can be checked." says Barry Cornell, manager of the Lehman plant. "Unlike self feeders, you can control the amount fed, and the time of feeding."

When activated, the unit feeds out ½ lb. of grain or pellets per second and can be set to run several times each day. Feed is spread by a rotor, powered by a battery which lasts 2 to 6 mos. Feed is spread up to 75 ft. away, depending on height off the ground.

Feed flow is adjustable and the unit will handle pellets up to % in, dia.

Sells for \$278, with 250 lbs. storage capacity. A 1000 lb. capacity feeder sells for \$478.

# New "Roll-Back" Bed For Pickups

"So far as we know, it's the first roll-back truck in the industry for 3/4 ton pickups." says Don Brown, designer of Roll Arc, a new roll-back truck bed that fits both 3/4 and 1 ton pickup trucks.

"It's hydraulically powered, so you can lift a full load with a ¾ ton pick-up. Hydraulics also let you install a roll-back on a truck with automatic transmission," Brown explains.

The 3/4 ton Roll Arc has a lifting capacity of 3,000 lbs. It features an electric winch for loading and anchoring freight. Bed is 84 in. wide. 136 in. long and includes a grilled

backboard up front and stake pockets around the edges. The bed for 1-ton pickups is 88 in. wide and 188 in. long.

"The bed slides back 36 in. before lowering to the ground. You can drive small implements right onto the truck and easily load or roll other loads right on. Otherwise, it can be used like a regular flatbed," says Brown.

#### DOORS SLAM SHUT WHEN ANIMAL ENTERS

## Painless Way To Trap Wild Animals

Want to get rid of elusive squirrels. raccoons or other animals around your buildings without having to use steel-jawed conventional traps?

If so, you'll be interested in the Havahart cage trap, marketed by Woodstream Corporation, Lititz, Penn. It's made of galvanized steel wire and comes in a variety of sizes to catch animals live without injuring them or causing pain. Trapped animals can then be either moved to a remote area or game refuge and released, or killed quickly and humanely.

"It's a humane way of removing and relocating an animal to allow it its rightful place in nature's scheme." says Rolf Hildinger, trap specialist with the company.

Cage traps are not a new idea, but the Havahart trap has some different features that make it especially effective, says Hildinger. It comes in sizes small enough to trap a mouse or sparrow, or big enough to trap a dog. All models are equipped with doors on both ends that are propped open when the trap is set and which fall shut when the trap is entered from either end. An animal will enter a trap when it can see through it without any obstructions. explains Hildinger.

The open ends also make it ideal to set along a fence, or on a trail where animals run. In their natural travel, they will run right into the trap.


Havahart traps are safe to set anywhere without posing a threat to children, pets or livestock as there are no steel jaws to set off accidentally.

The cage traps generally are set with bait to lure the animal. When it enters, the doors slam shut. The animal can be carried in the trap to be released in another area. Or, it can be killed while still in the trap. To dispose of a skunk, for example, you simply cover the cage with a cloth and move it quietly to a location

where the skunk can be released or shot. Skunk scent on a cage seems to make it even more attractive for catching other animals, says Hildinger.

Havahart traps come in seven sizes ranging from 10 by 3 by 3 in. for mice, to 70 by 30 by 30 in. for dogs and coyotes. Also included in the line are 24 by 16 by 8 in. sparrow and pigeon traps that hold 10 or 12 birds and reset themselves automatically each time after a bird is caught.
