THEY HANG FROM WALL, CEILING OR DOOR

Room "Organizers" Tidy Up Loose Ends

"I got the idea one day when I found my daughter's winter mittens and caps in a piled-up mess in a closet. I decided there had to be a better way to organize," says Rose Virnig, Morris, Minn. who's begun marketing a room organizer called "Hang-Ups".

The new household accessory is simply a 17 by 34-in. metal frame that's criss-crossed with a grid of steel wire. Sturdy clips that hook anywhere on the frame are used like jumbo clothes pins to hold everything ranging from mittens and gloves to shoes, caps, baseball mitts, frisbees, and so on. The Hang-Up frame is made to hang from a wall, the

back of a door, or even horizontally from a ceiling with four cords, which is a great way to dry wet mittens or gloves over a wood stove, notes Virnig. When hung against a wall or door, the metal frame is held away from the wall by 1-in. thick spacers.

Each unit holds as many as 75 clips. "The more people who see it, the more uses we come up with. It's great in the house, garage, shop or barn," notes Virnig. Hang-Ups sell for \$15.95, plus \$3 shipping.

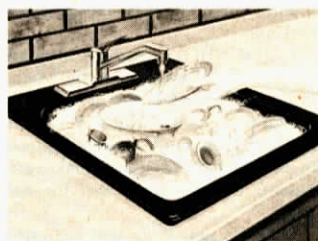
Handy New "Rinser" For Washing Dishes

Once you try it you'll wonder how you ever got along without the new "Suds-Away" dishwashing aid designed to carry rinse water away in single basin sinks.

Suds-Away lets you wash and rinse dishes in the same sink basin without mixing the rinse water with the dish water. Made from heavy plastic, it stands over the drain, acting as a sink stop, and leaves the drain open so that both rinse water and liquids left in dishes or glasses can be poured into the upper disc and down the drain.

The Suds-Away swivels back and forth and adjusts up and down to adapt to different sinks. The suction of the water locks it in place over the drain.

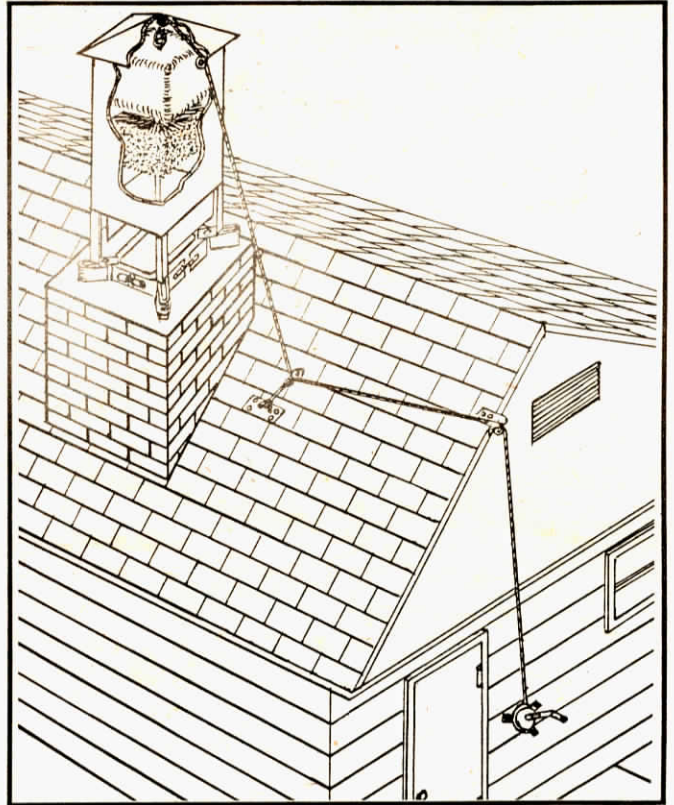
"It gives you the convenience of a double basin sink," says Dave Perlik, national sales manager for the manufacturer, Duchess Royale, Inc., who

New Chimney Cleaner Keeps You Off The Roof

If you avoid cleaning the chimney on your wood-fired stove or furnace because of the work or expense, you'll be interested in this new "Climb-No-More" chimney cleaner that lets you do an entire cleaning job in 45 sec. or less and never leave the ground.

Invented by Dave Ryden of Ryden Development, Hallock, Minn., the new cleaner consists of a housing that mounts above the chimney opening on top of the house and a weighted brush stored inside the house. A rope is guided from the housing through pulleys to a winch that mounts at ground level.

To operate, you simply close all dampers, then lower the 24-lb. cleaning brush and weight assembly down the chimney. When it reaches bottom, you crank it back up into the housing. Once inside the housing, bottom doors keep all soot and creosote out so cable and guides don't plug up or get frozen in place by ice and snow. The brush housing doubles as a rain cap and down draft control.

New Doorbell Shines Light On Door Lock

Hate fiddling in the dark to find the right key and fit it into the keyhole? That's the problem Wayne Walker and David Barton, Edmonton, Alb., set out to solve when they designed "Lock Lite".

Lock Lite replaces the doorbell and shines a light on the door — right at the handle — making it easy to find the right key to unlock your door. You don't have to remember to leave the porch light on. The inventors say Lock Lite illuminates most of the

door using a 4-watt automobile bulb that shines 24 hours a day.

Lock Lite uses the same low-voltage electric wiring used for your doorbell. The doorbell itself works the same as always.

The 2 by 2-in. Lock Lite sells for \$12.98 (Canadian).
