Diapers For Dogs!

"They're designed to keep any house dog from wetting the carpet and furniture," says the manufacturer of new disposable diapers for dogs.

Called "Doggie Didees," they're made of terry cloth pants and disposable liners. To put the diapers on a male or female dog, you simply put the dog's rear legs through the leg holes, adjust the waistband along the dog's waistline, then insert the liner. When the dog wets the liner, you replace it with a fresh one.

"Doggie Didees" are not designed to collect feces. They're available in 5 sizes, for dogs weighing up to 45 lbs., and in 2 colors - hot pink and baby blue.

Suggested retail price for a combination box including 2 Didees and 24 medium size replacement liners is \$9.95.

EVEN THE BATHTUB'S CONCRETE Have You Ever Seen A Concrete House?

"It took me three years to build but I never borrowed a penny," says Albert Nicholas, Chiefland, Fla., who built a one-of-a-kind house out of poured concrete. The roof, walls, floor, bathtubs and every other component of the 1,600 sq. ft. home - except for doors and windows - are made of concrete.

"I got married for the first time at age 53 and promised my wife I would build her a house. I made many blueprints until I was finally satisfied with a 2-bedroom, 2-bath design that included living, dining and utility rooms in addition to the kitchen. I formed bath tubs out of concrete directly in the floors of the bathrooms. One is pear-shaped and the other, in the master bedroom, is in the form of a diamond. The living room is 14 by 30 ft. and the free-standing fireplace - made out of concrete - is located 5 ft. from the front door to form a natural foyer.

The arched room at the center is the living room. I decorated the outside walls by installing 8-in. glass blocks and 4-in. dia. pieces of pvc pipe with red, white and blue enses in them. I put phone and stereo jacks in every room.

To build the frame of the house, I bought 6,000 ft. of 3/8-in. dia. reinforcing rod and elded them 1 ft. apart vertically and horizontally. I used 5/8-in. rerod around the windows and doors. I put panels of 1-in. styrofoam between rows of rerod. Forms were built and the liquified concrete was 'injected' with a special gun that required a compressor, mixalator truck, and a concrete pump. It cost \$90 a yard and I used 71 yards, or 142 tons for the entire house. I put two coats of white sealant on the outside."

'MORE THAN A COVER'

Reupholstery Kit For Pickup Seats

"It's more than a seat cover," says K and M Mfg. of its new do-it-yourself reupholstery kit for full-size Ford and General Motors pickups.

You remove the entire seat, take off the old upholstery cover and then install the new one, using supplied rings to secure it to the seat," explains Marv Mulder, president. "The outer covering, made of 100% nylon fabric, has a 1/2 in. thick foam backing to provide extra padding.

The kits, available in seven tweed colors — gray, light brown, dark brown, blue, red and burgundy — sell for \$139.95.

Spruce Up Your Mailbox!

Here's a fast, easy way to spruce up your mailbox with a fancy, four-color mural that covers up unsightly dents and rust.

Your choice of a dozen different colored scenes is silk-screened onto a polyethylene cover that wraps over the top and sides of the mailbox. An opening is cut out for the flag's mounting hinge. Two bungee cords running underneath the box hold the cover in place.

The murals (same image on both sides of the box) come with a name plate (holds up to 18 characters each 1 in. high) that affixes to the top of the box.

Cost of the murals is \$12.95 for standard mailboxes, and \$15.95 for large ones. Colored murals are also available for affixing to the doors of pickups or straight trucks. The sell for \$12.50 (12 by 18 in. mural) and \$14.50 (18 by 22 in.).
