

## “Peel And Stick” Engine Preheater

The ‘peel & stick’ Universal Preheater attaches to the bottom or the side of the oil pan and converts the housing into a heat transfer element. It warms the oil without burning it making cold starts easy. It can be used on




gearboxes, transmissions, transfer cases, water tanks and even bulk oil tanks. The Preheater plugs into any 120 or 240 volt outlet and consists of a thin silicone fiberglass pad containing a metal grid. To install it, you clean an area on the bottom or side of the oil pan and press the pad onto it, then use silicone to seal the edges of the pad and place a flexible ceramic insulation pad over it. It is available in several models depending on the lube capacity. A 50 watt unit sells for \$42 and a 350 watt unit sells for \$133.

## Raccoon Trap Safe To Use Anywhere

The Duke DP Coon Trap eliminates a big problem when setting a trap. You want to catch a raccoon, not the neighbor’s dog.

The dog-proof style has been around for years, but the Duke Company, which has been making traps since 1986, has improved and modified it to sell at the low price of \$12.95 each or \$149.95 a dozen.

“It’s specific for raccoons,” says Bill Duke, who is part of the family-owned company, which started selling the trap in July and has already had a tremendous response.

Instead of a pan found on a traditional leghold trap, the trap has a 1 1/2-in. steel pipe with a trigger inside to spring the trap. It’s based on habit. A raccoon will reach in for bait or lure placed in the pipe and pull back.

Since dogs won’t reach into the trap with their paw, the trap’s especially useful in

populated settings with raccoon problems. Slip a marshmallow or cotton ball with coon lure on it into the pipe to set the Duke DP Coon Trap. Then jab the spear end into the ground at a slight angle so it’s at eye level for a raccoon.

## Blue Jeans Like Granddad Used To Wear Handmade One Pair At A Time

Jeans makers Doug and Elaine Haga of Monmouth, Ore., know a thing or two about good, old-fashioned quality.

The Hagas take orders from all over the world for their durable, handmade jeans that they call “the toughest work jeans in America.” Customers must agree, because demand for their product has been growing since they first started the business, “Pedee Jeans,” in 1983.

Named for their small community, Pedee Jeans are designed to last twice as long as regular commercial jeans, thanks to their lock stitch construction and reinforced stress areas.

“Many of our customers are in the logging industry, so they’re made to stand up to the toughest working conditions in the world,” says Doug.

The Hagas say the tough jeans take longer to make, slowing down production. However, the couple long ago opted for quality instead of quantity, and that decision has kept their product in high demand.

They produce only a couple thousand items of clothing per year from their rural home shop. Doug cuts the 14 3/4-oz. American-made denim while Elaine does the majority of the sewing.

“We have four main jean styles - a full cut, heavy duty work jean, a double-thick front jean, a street jean, and a safety jean with a receiver cup for your Kevlar ballistic pad in the front panel. Another popular item is their

handmade western-style denim jacket.
