

Powerful Lights for Nighttime Farming

High intensity portable floodlights designed specifically for nighttime farming or repair work are new from Permavolt, Inc.

Light Cannon GF-1 swivels in all directions to brilliantly flood wide areas for searching or patrolling. Or, it can be locked in a set position to illuminate a field, building, machine being repaired, or other work areas.

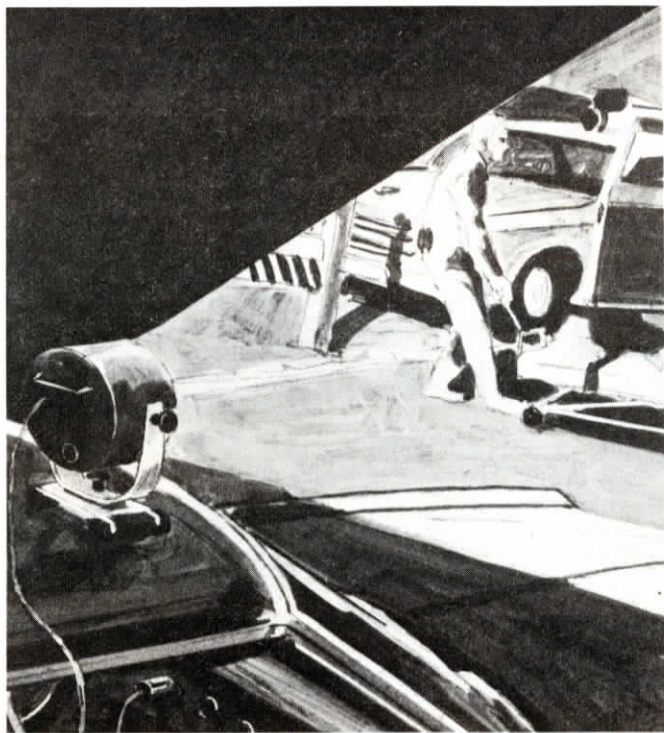
Light Cannon GF-2 is similar except that it has high powered beams both front and back. One serves as a standby in case the other burns out. It also has built in flashing capability and can be used in a variety of warning and signaling applications.

Both models operate off a 12V car, truck or tractor battery, or optional battery pack. Their light intensity

is said to be "brighter than 800 standard two-cell flashlights". Both models are compact for portability and come with a magnetic base for setting on top a car, truck or tractor. To illuminate extra large areas, two Light Cannons can be connected in series through built-in receptacles. A special high intensity bulb is available for long distance illumination and another for close-up, wide angle illumination.

List price on model GF-1 is \$69.95, and \$89.95 for model GF-2.

One way to cut costs might be buy used parts to fix your older tractors. They're readily available from a variety of suppliers and the going rate is about half of what you'd have to pay for new replacement parts.

New parts are guaranteed to be equal to or better than the original manufacturer's in quality and workmanship. New parts are not original but are of our own manufacture and are guaranteed for 90 days."

Where do the used tractor parts come from?

"Within a one year period, we dismantle several hundred used tractors. We have thousands upon thousands of parts which we don't have room to list in our catalog," explains Goodman.

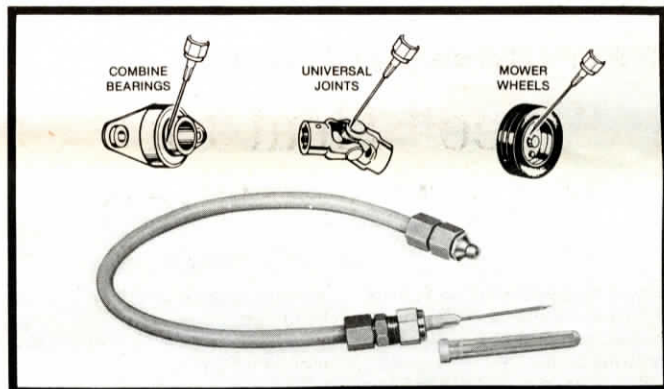

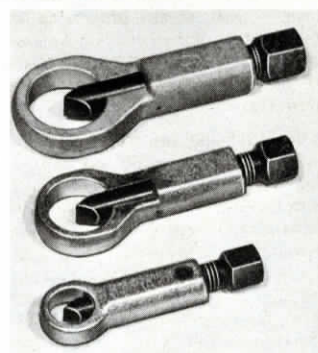


Grease Injectors

New grease injectors from Ag-Tronic make it easy to "needle" grease into sealed bearings without having to dismantle the equipment.

You simply attach the injector to your hand grease gun and slip the stainless-steel surgical needle under or through the bearing seal. The needle is small enough to get through the seal on most sealed bearings, yet big enough so grease normally used in the gun will flow through it. On some bearings, it may be necessary to drill a small hole for the injector needle. In addition to greasing sealed bearings, the injector needle is ideal for lubricating "hard to reach" points of friction, the manufacturer points out. Available in Model 401, which attaches directly to your grease gun, and Model 400, which comes with a flexible tube attachment.
