## Heavy-Hauling Pickups Pull Like Mack Trucks



Dan Hampton of Ten Sleep, Wyo., converted a 1977 Ford F-250 3/4-ton 4-WD pickup into a 6-WD model equipped with walking beam rear axles and a 12-ft. steel flatbed. "It's a great all-around ranch truck for hauling hay, machinery, and livestock. I've hauled loads weighing up to 33,940 lbs. gross," he says.



This eye-catching "Ultimate Pickup" was displayed at a recent farm show in Saskatchewan. "It pulls like a semi but rides like a car," says a local dealer. It's a 2 1/2-ton Crew Cab pickup that sits atop a low-profile chassis with a GCVW of 31,000 lbs. Power is supplied by a Caterpillar in-line 6-cyl. 215 hp diesel engine. It comes with an air ride suspension and a wheel base that's almost 240 in. long.
