Mark Jacobs Associate Editor Ronald White, Scotts, Mich.: "We were told it would increase milk production, improve herd health and improve breeding. It did just the opposite. We lost production, breeding problems became terrible, and herd health in general was poor. We tried very hard for almost a year to make this machine work. When we finally decided to go back to our old way of feeding, production came right back up. We thought it might be a coincidence, so we went back to the computer feeder and production went back down. After a while longer we gave up and went back to our old way of feeding. "Our 1985 New Holland hydraswing 114 Haybine is our best buy. We've never before been able to put hay up so fast and so well. Works

"My best buy is my Jeep Cherokee.

E.C. Modlin, Purdy, Mo.: "My worst buy is my 1983 Ford 250 diesel 4-WD. At 35,000 miles, the starter and flywheel were replaced while the truck was still under warranty. At 52,000 miles, another starter and flywheel were needed, but the truck was out of warranty. At 55,000 miles, a front wheel fell off. A new hub and spindle were needed to fix it. While the truck was in the garage they found that the diesel pump leaked. It was taken off and took 22 days to fix. Before the truck pump was worked on I got 14.7 mpg but now I get 10.5. I've already filled out two requests to meet with Ford representatives but no luck vet.'

Lawrence Dool, Thorsby, Alta.: "Everytime I used it, it cost me at least \$400. Even when it did run right it never cut properly," says Lawrence about his "worst buy" 1976 Deere 800 SP swather.

He likes his Ford 5000 tractor, though. "It's a 67-hp. tractor. I pull a 4-16 plow in hayland with no problems or slippage, even though the soil here is a very hard, clay-type soil. My uncle came with his Deere 3140 to show how good his tractor was but he barely made one round. He had the power, but he slipped all the way and the tractor began to heat up on him. This tractor has 5000 hrs. on it now and I've never had to spend a cent on it other than for routine maintenance."

Not only does it start easy and handle superbly but the saw is of such good quality it requires less attention. I sawed 25 ricks of wood with it this past fall and am very happy with it."

for traction on my 4040 Deere with front-end loader. This year, with packed snow and ice, I've had no problems at all," reports Keith about his "best buy" Goodyear Dyna-Torque radial tires.

Norman Gagnon, St. Alphonse, Man.: "Right from day one there was a problem in the rear end. The transmission went out 4 times in 1100 hrs. That was enough to get it traded," says Norman, upset with his Versatile 555 tractor with 4-WD.

He traded it off for what he says is "the Cadillac of tractors, a Deere 8450 with 4-WD. It has over 1,800 hrs. and has never given a minute's trouble.'

Leonard Dicke, Sheridan, Ill.: "My worst buy is a Deere round baler. It was trouble, trouble and more trouble. It's supposed to have an auto twine wrap but the twine arm cycled part of the way sometimes and other times it didn't cycle at all. The bale track monitor is often not right. The dealer had never sold one of these balers before and did not know how to make it work right so I called Deere headquarters in Illinois but got no
