New Products From Europe

- The world's first on-farm butterfat tester. Developed in Denmark, this exciting new "tool" for dairymen is ready for marketing in the U.S. and Canada. It's fast, accurate and will sell for \$385.

- New-style corn heads with built-in choppers that let you harvest corn and chop the stalks in a once-over operation.

- Growing corn under plastic.
