PROTOTYPES TAKE TO THE FIELD



Most impressive single feature of the new Gleaner N6 "rotary" according to farmers who already own one is its tremendous capacity.

New Gleaner Rotary Combine

"It's got capacity you won't believe. There isn't anything on the market that can keep up with it," reports Charles Paulson, Minnesota farmer and proud owner of one of the first new Gleaner N6 "rotary" type combines from Allis Chalmers to roll off the assembly line.

Charles, who farms near Stewartville, purchased his new N6 from Sues Farm Equipment, Stewartville. He was moving through 170 bu. corn at 5 to 6 mph the day FARM SHOW stopped to see him and his new N6—one of about 55 prototypes which Allis Chalmers delivered this fall to select dealers throughout the U.S. and Canada.

On each round, Charles waded right into a low, wet spot in the center of the field and kept going until he either slogged through or got stuck. When the machine bogged down, a
