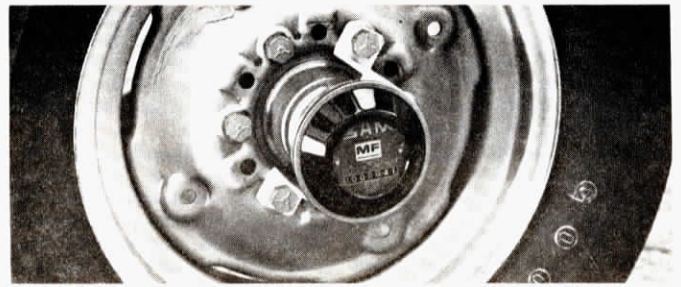

ROUND AND ROUND IT GOES

Revolution "Counter" Attaches to Wheel Hub

Round and round it goes — and where it stops gives you an accurate reading of square feet, acres or mileage covered. It's the new "Sam", a low-cost counter from Massey-Ferguson that attaches to the wheel of a tractor, truck or any wheeled implement.

Sam can help you keep tabs on such things as acres covered, fuel economy versus work performed, rate of seed, fertilizer or herbicide application, yield per acre, and maintenance scheduling. The device comes with a slide rule for direct conversion of wheel revolutions into square feet, acres or miles, or metric measurements.

Sells for \$45 and requires no maintenance. Mounting brackets are available, or can easily be made, to fit

most any driven wheel. It isn't recommended for mounting on a drive wheel because of wheel slippage which could distort the reading. To calculate metric measurements, you simply start with the correct metric measurement of the wheel radius. The furnished slide rule converts the reading into square meters, hectares and kilometers.

On tractors and other equipment operated at low speed, exact centering of the revo counter to the wheel is not required.
