Gary Russell, Allouez, Mich.: "I have used my 2020 Cen-Tec 3-in-1 portable jump pack numerous times with great satisfaction (www.harborfreight.com). It's powerful enough to start engines with dead batteries. I use it consistently with my Deere 425 tractor that I use to blow snow. It's kept me from having to buy a new battery for several years. It's a great value for the price I paid.

"Loctite Super Glue Gel Control doesn't hold anything together. I'm not happy with it all "

Kelly J. Rogers, Springtown, Texas: "The Shelby trailer flooring in my stock trailer is non-slip and rot proof (www.shelbytrailer. com; ph 580-252-2922). It should last longer than the trailer itself."

Joseph E. Athens, Bowdoin, Maine: Joseph's 2010 Cub Cadet/Yanmar Ex3200 hydrostatic sub-compact diesel tractor with loader rates as a best buy. "It starts without glow plugs any time of the year and has the original battery. It has many uses."

Robert Nehman, New Albin, Iowa: "My 1976 Bobcat 620 skid loader has become one of my 'best friends'. It never fails. I have a long steep gravel driveway. I can plow snow, drag, level, and backfill. It has over 3,000 hrs. with only a few minor repairs. It has a Wisconsin VH4D that I'd converted back to gas after spending most of its life in a barn running on propane. We love 'Betsy.' There aren't many 620s around, so I'm always looking for spare parts."

William Short, Rapid City, S.D.: "My 2020 Honda Ridgeline pickup is a best buy. We had four Dodge Ram pickups in the past. They were excellent trucks, but we found the Ridgeline serves the same need, gets better mileage, and fits our garage."

Thomas Smith, Moodus, Conn.: "My best buy is an L35 Kubota backhoe and loader tractor that I've used for loading logs onto my Wood-Mizer saw, digging the basement for my house, and hauling a lot of rocks. It was very dependable without any breakdowns.

"I'm handicapped so I made a winch system to lift myself onto the seat. I did that by installing a 3-in. I beam on the ROPS with bearings so it could move back and forth. Then I made a trolley that would hold a winch so I could hook a cable up to my Hoyer seat and lift myself onto the tractor seat. I double-lined the winch cable to slow down the speed. I raised the seat with a 2 by 4 so when I swung onto the seat, I'd clear the fender. When I was on the tractor seat, I could move the I-beam in, so it didn't extend outside the width of the wheels. I never had any problems with the tractor, and it was easy to shift. I could reach the 4-WD lever, the throttle and shift the gears, but I did need to add a length of pipe to the foot brake so I could control it with my hand. I even used the winch to lower myself onto a crawler and could even change the oil on the tractor."



Lori Lynn Parkin, Tremont, Ill.: "Pilot Knob Restorations in Galena, Ill. is a great supplier of quality replacement and OEM parts for International and Farmall tractors (www.pilotknobrestorations.com; ph 815-777-0826). I've used them often for new, used, and hard-to-find parts. They've been in business since 1997, and in 2008 Andy Berlage, son of the owners, started Blackjack Machine, a CNC shop that enables them to produce more products in-house. Andy and Donna Berlage now own and operate the Pilot Knob business. Pilot Knob offers machining services to repair worn parts, and they can also build custom parts and rare originals. I recently purchased an oil filter kit for my Farmall 1206, and it fit perfectly. The install took less than 30 min. to complete.'

Ryan Solberg, Goodridge, Minn.: "The power steering and hydraulic deck lift on my Deere X540 lawn mower work great. Lets me give my yard a golf course finish."

Ryan isn't pleased with his **Arctic Cat** DVX 250 4-wheeler. "The design is poor, and it has a lot of transmission problems. It doesn't stand up well at all. Arctic Cat needs to develop pride in their products again."

Earl Berry, Batesburg, S.C.: "My DeWalt 18-volt reciprocating saw is a sorry saw. It'll run for about 1 min. and quit. I bought two new batteries, but they were no help."

Steven Micah Lapp, New Holland, Penn.: "I have a couple of best buys. I subscribed to FARM SHOW just this year, and it's well worth it. I've gotten many ideas to make life easier on the farm.

Richard Caldwell, Bethany, W.Va.: "My 2020 Hypertherm 45 XP plasma cutter cuts metal effortlessly and easily. It's easy to operate, handle, and move."

Zachary Garman, East Earl, Penn.: Zachary nominates his 2021 Kubota SVL75-2 skid loader with an enclosed cab as a best buy. "It's been very reliable. With the tracks, we can do almost anything."

Zachary isn't pleased with his 2005 **Deere** 250 wheel loader. "We were constantly replacing hoses, and the controls were fatiguing. The lights gave us no end of trouble."

Gary Ahlbrecht, Brownton, Minn.: "My Toro Titan zero-turn lawn mower does what I expect it to do. The 26-hp. Kohler v-twin is powerful and always starts. It cut my mowing time almost in half. I had a Toro Proline 120 that I was very happy with.
