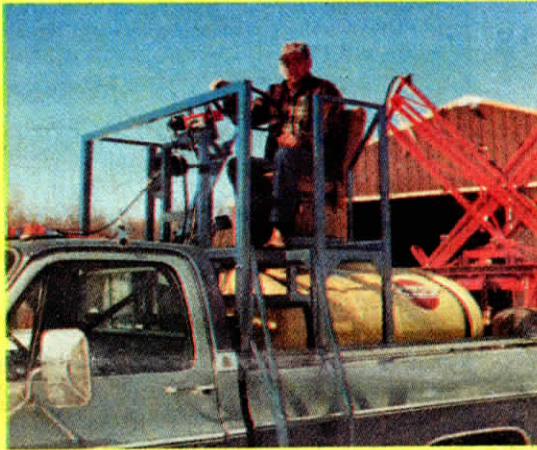

## "VISION TOWER" FOR PICKUPS

### Look What He's Done With The Driver's Seat!

You've never seen anything like it — a crow's nest cockpit for pickups that lets you drive from on top, rather than inside, the cab.

"We think it's one of the best improvements in crop spraying ever developed," says North Dakota farmer Willard Brusseau, of Osnabrock, inventor-manufacturer.

From the "Vision Tower" seat atop the truck, you can start and stop the engine, shift gears, accelerate, brake and steer.

"By sitting about 6-ft. off the ground high up in the tower, you have 90% better vision on the last row sprayed — which is especially helpful in tall grain and rolling fields so you don't gap or overlap spray coverage. Sitting high also makes it easier to see the back boom and to spot spray," says Brusseau whose pickup is equipped with a 300-gal. spray tank and 78-ft. boom.

Vision Tower sits just behind the pickup cab with its framework bolting to the truck bed's stake holes. It has a steel mesh floor and steps for easy access.

Gear shifter, accelerator, and
