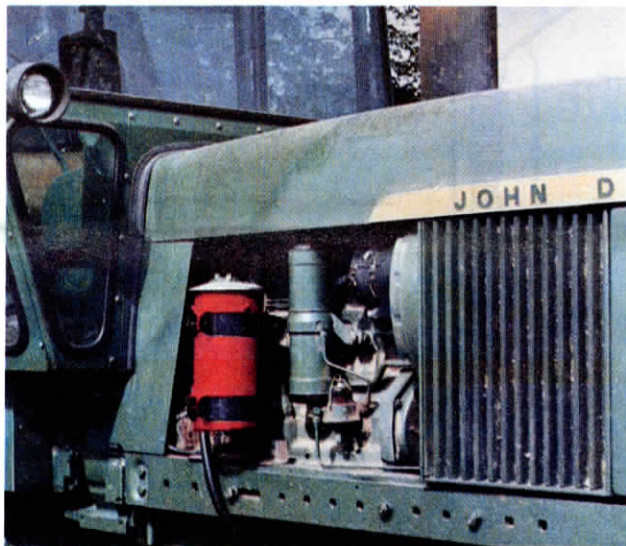

ELIMINATES HAVING TO CHANGE OIL

New Oil Refiner for Farm Tractors



Phoenix electric oil refiner, designed for do-it-yourself installation, is equipped with a heating element to remove moisture from oil as it refines it.

Backed by almost 10 years' experience with over-the-road trucks, earth-moving equipment and other industrial uses, an Oklahoma firm is moving into the farm market with an electronic oil refiner which virtually eliminates having to change oil.

"The product is new to most farmers but well-known to hundreds of truckers, contractors and other owners of industrial engines who have used it successfully in more than 60,000 different applications," says Glenn Priest, president of Re-Fillco Corp., a division of Thermodyne Corp., Norman, Okl., manufacturer of the Phoenix Electric Oil Refiner. "Some of the first engines to use our refiner have been running 7 years without an oil change," Priest told FARM SHOW.
