



"Feedpusher" Cleans Out Feed Alleys

New "Feedpusher" uses a worn-out rear tractor tire to sweep feed off concrete alleys and into low-lying feed bunks.

You drill four holes in the top side of the tire to attach the steel "pusher" frame to the tire. A steel plate mounts on the underside. The tire rotates as it rubs against the concrete. Four angled pipes at the top of the framework hold the unit to the loader bucket.

To detach, you just lower the bucket and drive away. The Feedpusher unit can also be 3-pt. mounted.

"No-Rot" PVC Barn Door

If you're tired of barn doors that rot out or rust from moisture and hard use, you'll want to take a look at this new heavy-built maintenance-free PVC door that's built to last.

The door is made of white 1 3/4-in. thick reinforced PVC panels "plasti-welded" together. The door won't rust or sag and you can't dent it, according to Harold Stump, president of R&D Equipment. Can be used for interior or exterior doors (the PVC panels are UV inhibited). When used on an exterior opening, the door can be filled with 1 1/4-in. thick rigid insulation.

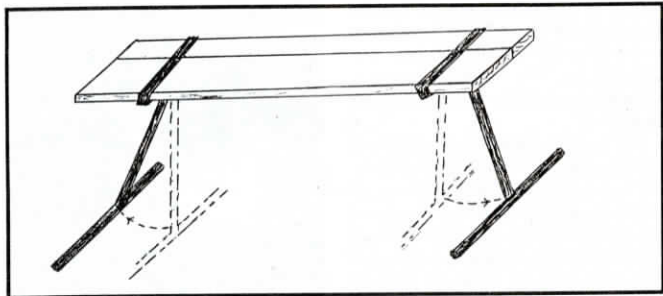
The door is fitted with four double-leaf hinges and a "no-nonsense" steel latch that holds the door tightly but has no intricate

mechanisms to fail. It also has a retractable sill-sealer that eliminates the need for a threshold. When the door shuts, the rubber seal drops down to close off the bottom of the door. As the door opens, the seal lifts up out of the way.

"It never needs painting and will look like new for years. It's fully weatherstripped," says Stump.

Standard 24, 32, and 36-in. widths available to fit 81-in. high openings. Custom sizes also available.

Slick New Way To Make Portable Table, Scaffold

Just slip "Plankmates" over the end of a 12 by 2-in. plank (or smaller) and you can make a handy portable table or scaffold in seconds without nails or screws.

Invented in New Zealand, the 3-ft. tall all-steel legs self lock under load. Once you slip them over the plank, you angle them either in or out to brace them.

They're great for painting and wallpapering, working on big vehicles, and many other jobs.

Kelderman Tracks Mount On Deere Combines

Those "high drive" row crop rubber tracks from Kelderman Mfg. that we told you about (Vol. 17, No. 6) are now available for Deere 9500 and 9600 combines. Built in 30 or 36-in. widths, the tracks mount directly on the combine's final drive and wheel hub. A pair of support beams extend from one side of the combine to the other to tie the two tracks together. A built-in suspension system provides 2 in. of movement to absorb shocks and eliminate the rough ride normally associated with direct-drive tracks.

The suspension is computerized using hydraulic cylinders backed by an accumulator and electronic sensor. The large diameter high drive wheel doesn't change your ground speed. The 30-in. track sells for \$22,000; the 36-in. track for \$25,000. Rubber track systems for Case-IH, White, and Massey Ferguson combine models are being developed. Nifty Cab For Deere Gator

The popular Deere Gator, a 6-wheel AMT available in 2 or 4-WD versions, can now be equipped with a cab.

Made by Femco, Inc., McPherson, Kan., the 70-in. high cab has a plastic canopy, large tempered glass windshield with a clear vinyl window in back, removable black vinyl doors, plastic sliding door handles, and a hand-operated windshield wiper. The cab mounts on a ROPS (rollover protective structure). Options include an electric windshield wiper, heater, and lights.

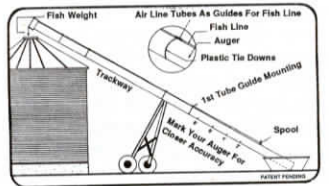

"Fishing Line" Bin Check

You can use 10-lb. fish line to check the grain level in your bin from the ground with a new kit from Damp Enterprises, Mazenod, Sask.

Kit includes fish line, a fish line weight, pieces of air hose that serve as guides for the fish line, and adhesive patches to secure the air hose to the auger. The line is threaded through the guides to the top of the auger. The weight is attached to that end of the line. A 1/4-in. washer attaches to the bottom end of the line and hooks onto an L-shaped hook. You mark the auger in 2, 4, 6, and 8-ft. intervals. To check grain level, you let the weight fall down into the bin. When the weight hits the grain, you just see where the washer is on the scale marked onto the



auger. If it's at the 4-ft. mark, grain is 4 ft. from the top of the bin.

Drill Fill "Brush" Auger Rolls On Track

This new "radius-tracked" PVC drill fill brush-type auger rolls from side to side on a steel track mounted behind the drill, allowing you to completely fill the drill without the need for a cross auger, says Wachtman Agri Supply, Grelton, Ohio.

The bottom of the auger remains stationary behind the center of the drill and acts as a pivot point. The auger is powered by tractor hydraulics. It's made from PVC tubing and is equipped with bristle-type auger flighting with polypropylene tips that handle seed gently. Available for the Deere 750 15-ft. no-till drill and Case-IH and Great Plains 15-ft. drills.
