

Cow Stool Is "Udder Delight"

People can't help but laugh when they see these Holstein stools built by commercial wood crafters John and Sharron Solinger, Monkton, Vermont.

The Sollingers live on a farm and raise a few head of Holsteins. When their daughter Ellen was 2 she loved to ride the cows so John decided to make her a "rocking Holstein" for Christmas. While building it, he and Sharron got the idea of putting an udder under a stool and the idea took off.

Response at shows to the stool was tremendous and one large cooperative even bought 3,000 of the stools to give as premiums to members.

The legs of each stool are crafted from maple while the tops are made from southern poplar. Each stool is shaped by hand on a lathe, and then painted black and white with a red udder.

The copyrighted cow stools come in five different sizes, from the 12-in. tall "milking



stool" to the 29-in. tall bar stool. Prices range from \$66 to \$128. The Sollingers also make "flamingo" and "dalmatian" stools, as well as deluxe snow sleds.

Sudsy Soap Dispenser

New Soap Sudser produces a handful of rich soap lather at the touch of a fingertip to the base of the unit, eliminating the mess of traditional bar and liquid soaps.

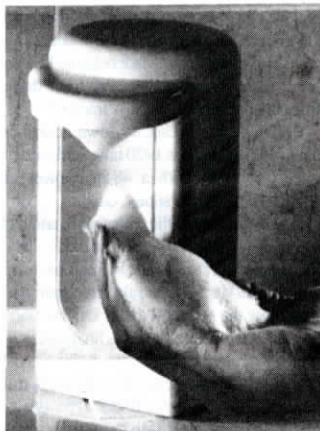
"Washing with a bar of soap is often messy because the bar can slip out of your hands," says Diane Adair, company representative. "The Soap Sudser is especially good for young children."

The dispenser works by mixing 4 parts water to 1 part liquid soap. The 16-oz. unit operates on a D-cell battery. A built-in air pump mixes water with liquid soap to create the foamy, pre-lathered soap. The unit stops instantly after using so there's no dripping mess.

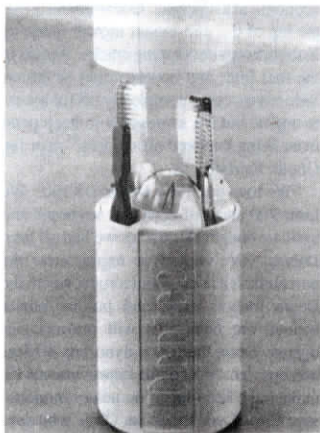
A child's version in the shape of an elephant's head comes with an attachment that allows it to hang in the shower.

Electronic Measuring Tape Has Built-In Calculator

You can take super-accurate electronic measurements with this new 12-ft. tape that can also add, subtract, multiply, and divide so you can use it not only to take wall to wall measurements, but also to calculate sizes and volumes of objects.

You extend the tape, press the tape lock button, and the measurement is automatically displayed on an LCD screen. For wall-to-wall measurement, the case length is added automatically to the measurement. For area calculation, simply input two measurement readings (length and height) and you'll get the answer immediately. For volume calculation, enter the third measurement (width). The volume of the object



will be obtained instantaneously. To measure the area in a circle, measure the diameter and by a simple touch of a key you'll get the answer.
