

Quick Hitch For Deere Loaders

"It's built stronger than your loader itself," says Jesse Machine Works of the firm's new Quick Hitch for Deere model 145, 146, 148 and 158 loaders.

It attaches to your loader with furnished pins and stays on the loader permanently. You just drive into the bucket pins, lift up and drive away, completing the hookup in seconds right from the tractor seat. To unhitch the bucket just lift two levers, then set the bucket down and back away.

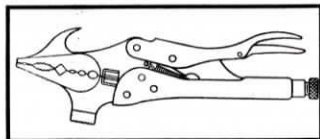
Many Uses For New "Super Magnets"

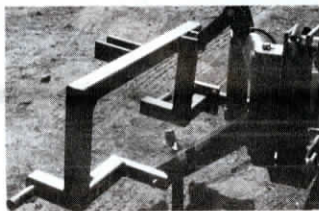
Hay Baler Scale

This new hay and straw baler scale from Meadow Brook International weighs each bale as it's made.

Individual bales are weighed on the tail chute of the baler. Their weight is displayed on a digital indicator located in the cab in full view of the operator who can adjust chamber pressure to maintain the desired bale weight as field conditions change.

The scale is designed with built-in bounce protection for weighing accuracy. It adapts to most makes of conventional rectangular balers. Prices start at about \$800 for the scale and digital weight indicator.

Offset Hitch For Disc Mowers

This new offset hitch mounts on any disc mower and hooks up to the 3-pt. hitch on your tractor. It moves the mower over 10 in. so that you have use of the full width of the mower cutterbar, says LM Products, Cold Spring, Minn.

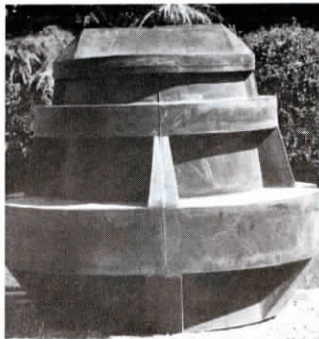
"The problem is that farmers are using bigger tractors to pull their disc mowers and the larger tires take up more cutting area," says Larry Ackerson. "The result is that 6 to 10 in. at the end of the cutter bar can't be used because it's directly behind the tire. This hitch gets the mower out from behind the tire. If your tractor has a quick hitch, you can hook up without getting off the tractor." Sells for \$289.

Custom Duck Blind

"Hunters who've used it tell us it works great," says Daryl Alberico, manufacturer of a custom-built blind for duck and goose hunting.

Molded in one piece of polyethylene with a built-in ultra violet ray inhibitor, it's 48 in. high, 32 in. in dia. at the top opening, and weighs 120 lbs.

"It's built to withstand sub-zero temperatures without cracking," says Alberico. "You can bury it completely in the ground, or partially buried and camouflaged with stalks, weeds or straw."

There's room inside for a folding chair and built-in storage compartments for storing two guns, shells, decoys and bagged game.

New Multi-Use Sprayer Caddy

"My new sprayer caddy pulls behind your planter or field cultivator and can be used to apply herbicides as well as liquid fertilizer. It eliminates the need for saddle tanks," says Karl Hiler, New Washington, Ohio.

Hiler's 3-wheel caddy, with two rear 1600 by 16 tires and a front 1100 by 16 tire, holds a 500, 750, or 1,000-gal. tank. It can be equipped either with a ground-driven piston pump or a hydraulic pump that sends chemicals to booms on the implement.

"The caddy can be pulled behind a no-till corn planter to apply liquid fertilizer or 28% nitrogen, behind a toolbar to sidedress corn, or behind a field cultivator to apply preplant herbicides. One big advantage is that if your tractor fails, you don't have to worry about mounting saddle tanks on another tractor."

An electric magnetic clutch is used to engage and disengage the ground-driven pump which is controlled by a toggle switch mounted in the cab. Two alligator clamps hooked to the battery supply power to the toggle switch.

Sells for \$4,500 to \$5,500 depending on size of tank and pump.

Electronic Trailer Hitch-Up System

If you've ever tried to imagine the perfect trailer hitchup device - one that would let you line up a hitch pin without getting out of your pickup cab - you'll want to take a look at this new electronic hitching system that acts like a second set of eyes when backing up to hitch.

The system uses radar and sonar. Two tiny receivers mount on the bumper on either side of the ball hitch. A transmitter, which mounts on top of the trailer tongue, shoots a beam to the receivers. The receivers are hooked to a small light display box in the cab with a row of vertical and horizontal lights. The driver simply steers the truck according to the position of the lights. When the center light lights up, the hitch is directly under the tongue, in perfect position for hookup.

New Ditcher-Terracer

"After spending lots of time and money repairing ditcher-terracer, I decided to build my own. There's nothing else like it on the market," says Junior Liebrecht, Continental, Ohio.

The 3-pt. mounted Liebrecht ditcher is equipped with a 5-ft. dia. cutting wheel that throws dirt up to 120 ft. to the side of the machine. Or, with the hydraulic side hood lowered, it will drop dirt close in for terracing.

"It's particularly handy for making shallow, wide ditches to drain wet pockets in fields because the depth can be so easily controlled," says Liebrecht, who does custom drainage work. "It requires less maintenance because the blade operates at a slower speed and because there's no place for rocks and debris to bind up on it. Also, it's gear-driven instead of chain-driven. Less horsepower is needed because it throws dirt to the side instead of up into the air. And because dirt is never thrown more than 12 ft. high it won't interfere with laser guidance beams.

The machine is powered by a 1,000 rpm pto. Requires a 150-200 hp tractor.

Sells for \$9,600. Laser, receiver with solenoid valve, and 2-speed gearbox extra.
